Part One: The section sets up the narrative by introducing the social injustice and the narrator. It includes background research that explains the problem. The more engaging and compelling this section is, the better your grade. (20 points)

Part Two: The section develops the narrative and the incident. The persona becomes clearer as well. Elements may include dialogue, storyline, description, reflection, and supporting research to create a vivid picture of the event. An engaging story will help your grade. (20 points)

Part Three: This section offers a solution to the social injustice as well as an explanation of at least two researched ideas for how to improve the situation. Solutions that are logical and fully explained will improve your grade. The **final lines** provide a reflection on the events. (20 points)

Style: The text uses an engaging tone, sensory language and details to create a vivid picture of the social injustice, the events, the setting, and the characters. It includes at least TWO STYLE models: Dialogue, I am an Expert, Parallel Structure, Irony, or Description. (PINK) (15 points)

Research: Includes a variety of credible and appropriate resources (at least 5) that support your claim and provide authentic evidence. Includes at least 5 direct quotes (Yellow) and 10 additional facts (Green) (15 points)

MLA: Proper use of MLA Format--heading, in-text citations, Works Cited page (alpha order, hanging indentation) (10 points)

Writing Conventions: Demonstrates standard English conventions of usage and mechanics. (10 points)
